Annual Roofing Canada Awards

BACKGROUND

The Roofing Canada Awards program recognises outstanding workmanship, innovation, service to the community and service to the industry and is sponsored by the Canadian Roofing Contractors Association. All entries will be recognized by their peers for their significant contribution to the roofing industry.

CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD WILL INCLUDE:

Workmanship: Outstanding workmanship in a roofing application by a contractor and roofing crew. This can include a particularly challenging job, difficult design job, abnormal working conditions, difficult materials used, etc.

Innovation: Innovative solutions can include innovative project solutions to difficult jobs, smart solutions to a problem, special safety considerations, environmentally friendly projects, etc.

Service to the community: Service to the community can be a project where materials and/or time were donated to a worthy project that benefits the community.

Service to the industry: Service to the industry may include a significant contribution made to the roofing industry.

ELIGIBILITY

Unique roofing-related jobs, programs, and services that were completed in the last two years will be eligible for the competition.

The submitter can be employed by the roofing contracting company being nominated. Entries can also be submitted by CRCA Active, Associate and Industry members and CRCA Affiliate Associations.

ENTRY SUBMISSION

JUDGING CRITERIA

Judges are recognized professionals within the roofing industry. Judges will use the following criteria to evaluate proposals:

- A. Uniqueness of the project or activity
- B. Benefit to the roofing industry
- C. Use of innovation

THE REWARD

The Roofing Canada Award will be a plaque and certificate of achievement.

Roofing Canada Award winner will be formally saluted at a special CRCA Awards Ceremony during the Annual Conference.

Roofing Canada Award winners will also be recognized in Roofing Canada magazine and the CRCA Newsletter.

ENTRY PREPARATION

Your entry/application will consist of the following items:

- 1. The Official Entry Form including a description of the job, program or event.
- 2. Any relevant entry materials, in addition to the entry form from your company for consideration. Photographs, booklets and such are recommended but should only be submitted if they help describe the uniqueness of the project.
- 3. Package entries carefully. Applicants are responsible for all shipment and postage. In sending entries to CRCA, CRCA cannot be responsible for loss or damage to any entry submitted.
- 4. All entries become the property of CRCA. Do not send irreplaceable materials.

WHAT HAPPENS TO YOUR ENTRY

1. Entries are screened at CRCA office to verify eligibility.

- 2. Each entry is individually evaluated according to official judging criteria.
- 3. The highest-ranking entries will be evaluated to determine the winner of the Roofing Canada Award.
- 4. The decision of the judges is final, and scores for individual entries will not be disclosed.
